#### 2015 Church Planning Meeting November 15, 2014



2/3 c vanilla Greek yogurt

2 clementines, peeled

1 c chopped romaine lettuce

4 carrots, shredded (2 cups)

½ c ice cubes

Layer ingredients in a blender. Cover and blend about 30 seconds or until smooth.


Size Matters: 6 ounces is a snack; 12 ounces is a meal.
