



MISSION TRIP TO COCHABAMBA, BOLIVIA

January 18 - January 29, 2015



Missionary Nannette Locke and Rev. Ida Gice Smith traveled to Bolivia on a mission trip with the American Baptist Churches of the Rocky Mountain Region and the General Missionary Baptist Convention of Colorado.

Most Mission Trips are an adventure and Bolivia was no different. Most meals are served in the home where you stay; however, we did venture out for a few meals now and then.

Food was one of the great adventures. We enjoyed wonderful eating and dinning in Cochabamba. Our host, Carmen Flores (House of Hope), is an excellent cook and served a wide variety of Bolivian, American, and contemporary meals along

with a pizza night. For two evening meals, Rev. Ida prepared fried chicken, potato salad, ambrosia salad, vegetables and a peach cobbler. The next night was barbecue ribs. My, my, my, what a time we had! The chicken bones were eaten in some cases. We did venture away from Cochabamba (Clinical Days) and ate more traditional and differently prepared foods. The meals were delicious as if the meals were not eaten, we would offend our hosts. We took snacks, granola bars, cheese and crackers, etc. along with Pepto Bismol. Not one of us forgot our prescription of Cipro just in case we needed a good antibiotic. Ginger Altoids were invaluable for nausea and motion sickness. Roads are not paved outside of Cochabamba and up in the Altiplano.

PURPOSES & OBJECTIVES OF TRIP:

The huge migration that is happening throughout the world, from rural to urban centers. Estimates indicate that by 2040 more than 90% of Bolivia's population will be living in urban areas. People making these transitions frequently are trapped in poverty, human trafficking, prostitution, drug cultures and criminal activity. A ministry will need to be developed to help people moving from rural environments to urban centers.

The problem is multi-dimensional--involving issues such as employment, housing, education and training, human rights awareness, self-esteem, learned poverty behaviors, behaviors for urban life, to name a few.



Visiting rural areas - the Altiplano to see what could be added to their situation such as alternate crops, micro industries, improved access and use of water.



Health Clinics (2 days for children and expectant mothers).

Dental Clinics (2 days for children) in ToroToro.

Supplemented the dental clinics with more equipment - autoclaves, etc.

I enjoyed my trip and the service that was provided to the people of Bolivia. I had the privilege to spend two weeks observing the serving spirit of the

Missionaries from Loveland, Colorado. Pastor John Turnage, Pastor of First Baptist Church of Loveland, coordinated the trip. Rev. Ida Gice Smith and I arrived back in Denver on Tuesday, February 2, 2016 to measurable snow and cold temperatures.

The annual Business Meeting was held Saturday, January 23, 2016 from 10:00 a.m. – 12:30 p.m. This year's theme, "A Call to Oneness" John 17:20-21; Ephesians 4:4-6 was explained by Pastor Smith.

The church body voted and approved the returning Trustees for 2016. Returning Trustees are Bro. Jasper Armstrong, Bro. Frank Boldoe, Bro. Jack Choice, Deacon Lawrence Coleman, Sis. Nicole Hill, Sis. The year-end Financial Report was presented by Deaconess Margie Legins. After some discussion, the Financial Report was approved.

Bro. Boldoe presented the 2015 accomplishments and 2016 challenges for the church.

2015 Accomplishments:

- Continued to use a "Financial Practices" standard template in making financial decisions for the Church.
- Made several building repairs throughout the Church and parking lot
- Assisted the Deacon Board in creating an Employee Handbook
- Assisted the Deacon Board in creating job descriptions
- Created Statements of Work for contract work done at the Church
- Assisted the Deacon Board in creating a policy and procedure for the use and upkeep of Church vehicles
- Completed a Church property inventory
- Made needed Multi Media equipment purchase in December
- Sold the donated land in Southern Colorado
- Replace the HVAC unit outside the Pastor's office
- Repaired a major gas line on the North side of the Church

- Changed the CPA firm used to provide the Financial Review of the Church's financial records
- Oversaw the changes to PayPal
- Started the effort to receive donated vehicles in 2016.

2016 Challenges:

- Refinancing the Church mortgage estimated to be \$5.6 million
- Strengthening the financial condition of the Church
- Completing financial audit of the Church's financial operations
- Upgrading the Church's financial accounting system
- Reviewing and recommending changes to the Church's business and operational structure
- Selling unused computer hardware
- Repairing the Church roof
- Upgrading media and sound system
- Replacing the entire phone system
- Purchasing new Church vehicles
- Completing and implementing all pending policies and procedures by the end of the second quarter
- Recommending updates to the Constitution and By-Laws

The 2016 Budget was presented by the Trustee Ministry. After much discussion and a few recommended changes, the 2016 Budget was approved by the Church Body.

An Ad-Hoc Committee was established on Commissioning the Constitution and By-Laws. Committee members are Sis. Marilyn Brown, Sis Jane Clark, Deaconess Glenda Coleman, Deacon Lawrence Coleman, Deaconess Margie Legins, Sis. Lynette Murray, Sis. Nina Myles and Rev. Ida Smith.

Evangelism: Pastor Smith encouraged everyone to participate in corporate prayer at 7:00 on Wednesday evenings for the month of January.

Pastor's report on new member activity for 2015: 24 new adult members, and 11 children/youth. The church's total membership for 2015 was 862.

Pastor Smith announced his retirement effective the end of 2017.

Deacon Larry Howard presented the process and procedures for the establishment of the Pastor Search Committee as outlined in the Church's Constitution and By-Laws. The committee will consist of 12 members: 3 Deacons, 3 Deaconess, Chair of the Trustee Board, President of the Usher Ministry, A Mission representative, Superintendent of the Sunday School, Youth Pastor and 2 members from the congregation-at-large. The church voted to have Eileen Burnley and Angela Green Garland as the two members at-large. The members of the Pastors Search Committee are Deacon Lawrence Coleman, Frank Boldoe, Eileen Burnley, Glenda Coleman, Brenda Combs, Rita Cummings, Angela Green Garland, Larry Howard, Marion Ladd, Carla Ladd, Willie Mae Little, John Quick and Eddie J. Washington.





The Christian Scroll Ministry mourns the loss of its long-time advisor and advertising salesperson. Deacon Eugene Cornish, along with his wife, Mary, was instrumental in founding The Christian Scroll newsletter in 1988 when it was typed, printed in black and white and assembled here at Rising Star. Since that time, Deacon Cornish typed many articles and contacted many business owners trying to secure ads for the newsletter. The Christian Scroll Ministry was made stronger by the contributions of Deacon Cornish.

Deacon Eugene Cornish was born in Washington, D.C., an only child. He graduated from St. Emma Military Academy and immediately began a career in the U. S. Navy. His 20-year military career allowed him the opportunity to travel the world. He proudly served during the Vietnam War, retired and later received designation as a 100% disabled veteran. He felt honored to have served his country.

Deacon Cornish retired from the Navy in Honolulu, Hawaii and relocated to Denver, CO with his wife and children. He then embarked on a career with the U. S. Post Office for 20 years. After the second retirement, he went back to work Amtrak and later to the Buckley Air Force Base Commissary.

Deacon Cornish was a Lifetime Member and Past Master of the Daniel "Chappie" James Jr. Masonic Lodge #27. His hobbies included bowling, model trains and playing board games with his beloved family. He was an active member at Rising Star Missionary Baptist Church. He was especially proud of being a deacon and singing with the male chorus. His church and love of his pastor was something he always bragged about to everyone.

Deacon Cornish is survived by his wife of 58 years, Mary; two sons, two daughters, a niece he helped raise and a host of other relatives and friends.
